

Brook Traffic Light Tool

Course Outline

The Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool training course supports professionals working with children and young people to identify, understand and respond to sexualised behaviours.

Using a 'traffic light' system, you will learn how to recognise and identify sexual behaviours, differentiating between those which are part of healthy sexual development and those which are problematic or harmful, and develop an appropriate response that meets the needs of the child or young person.

Professionals must attend Traffic Light Tool training to be able to use the tool safely and, therefore, the tool cannot be shared with staff who have not completed training. You will have receive access to a digital version of the Traffic Light Tool on completion of this training.

The Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool is based on the original 'Traffic Light Guide' developed by Family Planning Queensland in Australia, now known as True.

The Traffic Light Tool supplements your safeguarding processes and is not a replacement for your organisation's safeguarding procedures.

The Traffic Light Tool is supported by the Telford and Wrekin Safeguarding Partnership.

This course provides 3.5 hours of continuing professional development time.

Objectives

By the end of the training you will:

- Learn how to recognise and identify sexual behaviours, differentiating between those which are part of healthy sexual development, and those which are problematic or harmful; and
- Develop an appropriate response that meets the needs of the child or young person.
